What is Medicine Hat LIP?

 The Medicine Hat LIP is a community initiative dedicated to improving the integration of newcomers.

What is the IAT?

The IAT is one of several committees under LIP. It is a selected group of volunteers who
have lived immigrant experience. The members of the IAT represent a diversity of
gender, ages, educational backgrounds, countries of origin, and length of Canadian
residency.

What does the IAT do?

The purpose of this committee is to guide the work of the LIP by offering the immigrant perspective. Projects might include assisting with the LIP needs assessment, website, and strategic plan. We will ask for advice on topics like developing a professional mentorship program or English conversation groups. LIP does not work directly with clients.

Who is eligible to apply to the IAT?

- Not born in Canada
- Over 16 years old
- Are planning to live in Medicine Hat or surrounding area for the next 1-2 years.

When does the IAT meet?

- To ensure our diversity requirements are met.

- Applicants will be invited for a 20 minute interview, to assess eligibility and diversity requirements.
